
May you be refreshed as you faithfully go about your good work this week.



A number of leaders have been (properly) concerned about what Greer and Horst have called *Mission Drift*. This is the temptation to move away from the depths of our Christian calling within Christian schooling. A.W. Tozer notes that this temptation – to stay true to our Christian mission, or not, faces all Christians in one way or another during their lifetime. He summarises the pressure to Mission Drift with this question: *Shall we modify the truth in doctrine or practice to gain more adherents?* (p. 39)

Tozer outlines several consequences that are evident when we move away from the truth in our doctrine and practice. His first one conveys the heart of the others:

One has been an absence of a spirit of worship... [The Lord's people in these

places] ...are poor victims of boards, churches, denominations and pastors [can we add principals and teachers?] who have made the 'noble' decision to modify the truth and practice a little. (p. 41)

And thus, we can pray: "Dear God, please help us to worship you more and more each day, in all we do in our school. Amen." This is what Tozer says is greatly needed: "The world is waiting to hear an authentic voice, a voice from God – not an echo of what others are doing and saying, but an authentic voice.
