

Entrepreneurial is one of those words that some Christians find uncomfortable. It seems somehow incompatible with ideas of Christian faith, or humility. It seems somehow "worldly".

One of the reasons that we come to this conclusion is that many entrepreneurs seem to be focussed upon financial gain, or being successful in business at any cost.

So, entrepreneurship has a public relations problem; some of the greatest temptations for humans seem to occur in this area (greed, envy, selfishness,

and others).

We also have an innate bias when we think about human vocations in the Body of Christ. Pastors and Missionaries are way up there... Entrepreneurs? Maybe a necessary evil!

We need to have the correct goal and purpose. If we see entrepreneurship as using a variety of methods to boldly, unashamedly but humbly proclaim Christ, and the mission and purpose of our Christian ministries, then maybe we're moving part-way to redeeming the concept.

Was Paul entrepreneurial as he travelled so widely, establishing churches wherever he went? Bold, but vulnerable. Focussed and determined. Risking health, safety, comfort and security for the joy of the Gospel and the growth of Christian communities.

We need to ensure the right methods and attitudes. Entrepreneurship requires initiative, motivation, sacrifice, and patience - all traits that the Bible encourages.


